Heemskerk was an integral player in developing Tasmania's wine industry, long before the island reached its current state of popularity. Graham Wiltshire established the Heemskerk vineyard in 1975 and today the label looks a little further afield, making wines that reflect some of Tasmania's best vineyard sites.



Peter Munro **winemaker comments**

vintage conditions: 2014 saw low yields in the vineyard due to poor fruit set and severe isolated spring frosts. The summer was warm, with temperatures slightly above average, this combined with below average rainfall in the months prior to harvest, resulted in an excellent year for Pinot Noir

grape variety: Pinot Noir

maturation: New (35%) and one Year old (65%) French oak

colour: Bright, vibrant red

nose: Floral and pretty, with strawberry fruit, supported by subtle oak

palate: Plush and generous, with cherry fruit, and fine tannins and spice

vineyard region: Coal River Valley and Derwent Valley, Tasmania

peak drinking: 2016 - 2020

harvest date: Late March and early April 2014

wine analysis: Alc/Vol: 12.5%,

Acidity: 5.3g/L, pH: 3.60

bottling date: April 2015
